ODYSSEA is developing an online platform which will provide data and information services to policy makers, marine planners and managers, commercial and recreational users, to support the sustainable development and conservation of the Mediterranean Sea.

- in situ marine sensors
- oceanographic modelling; and
- citizen science apps.
