# UfM Blue Economy Roadmap

Following the adoption of the **2021 UfM Ministerial on SBE**, UfM Co-Presidency, Secretariat, and UfM countries agreed to elaborate a Roadmap for the implementation of the Ministerial

- Landmark document in the region
- Overview and analysis of the joint needs, gaps and opportunities for future support, funding, and implementation <u>by Ministerial</u> <u>thematic priority</u> + Sketching out of ongoing initiatives, programmes and projects
- Potential avenues for future cooperation (promising pathways, processes and actions) that can be launched and scaled-up in the short, medium, and longer term
- Easy to handle Results-based Monitoring, Reporting, and Evaluation System

# **Progress in the implementation of the short-term priority actions**

Capacity Building on project proposal development	On October 25th, 2022, in Aqaba, a <b>Capacity Building session on project proposal development</b> was organised by the UfM Secretariat and delivered in the framework of the 12th UfM Blue Economy Working Group, and in a hybrid modality in order to allow wider participation of relevant blue economy stakeholders from various Mediterranean countries
Innovation ecosystems for blue economy value-chains	The webinar " <i>Financing Innovation Ecosystems for the Mediterranean Sustainable Blue Economy: Local actors, opportunities, and challenges</i> " was held on January 30 <sup>th</sup> , 2023. This UfM webinar aimed at shedding a light on the different actors, their experiences, and specific roles that contribute to supporting the development of innovation ecosystems in and for the sustainable blue economy across various Mediterranean countries.
Small-ports and marinas diversification	Support was provided for <b>project consortia to engage with east MED stakeholders</b> , so as to further support the ability of local small ports, harbours and marinas to act as 'innovation hubs' for a sustainable diversification of local business ecosystems, as well as develop maritime clusters across the southern shore of the Mediterranean.
Maritime Clusters	Under the 'flagship' call of the European Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund (EMFAF) 26 proposals were received by CINEA, including support to "sustainable ports and transport" in the Mediterranean (Topic 3).
MSP as a sustainable blue	On January 26th, 2023, CINEA and DG MARE officially <b>launched a Mediterranean MSP Community of Practice</b> during a kick-off meeting in Brussels where the experts discussed the structure and the action plan for next year.
economy 'enabler'	In the context of the existing EU policy framework and the broader political will to advance the MSP process in the Mediterranean, the establishment of this enlarged MSP Community of Practice/expertise would build on the work of the WestMed Initiative. This would also entail ensuring the appropriate flow of information between the enlarged MSP Community of Practice and the UfM Working Group on Blue Economy.

# **Results-based Monitoring, Reporting and Evaluation System** Implementation arrangements

**Straight-forward Results-based MRE system** to monitor the implementation of the Roadmap towards the implementation of the Ministerial

- Yearly updates by the countries <u>by Ministerial priority</u>, summarizing main achievements at national level (*policies*, strategies, initiatives, programs, projects, etc.) Annual baseline to visualize progress over time (First Reporting exercise by the countries: 14<sup>th</sup> BE WG; 14 March 2023, Brussels; Integrated into the Roadmap)
- Feeding on the above and in order to minimize reporting burden, the Roadmap will be updated every 2 years (2023 & 2025), including results and process indicators by Ministerial priority
- Mid-term external evaluation (tentatively 2025) in the context of the preparation of the next Ministerial Declaration
  - Scope and focus of the evaluation will be agreed based on the inputs received by the yearly updates and the biannual national reports on progress
