Support to Small-Scale Fisheries (SSF)	<b>Objective no. 4 of (IMS</b> ): "Activating the Partnership between the Public and Private Sectors in the Maritime Domain", takes into consideration the support of Small-Scale fisheries. Other	Lebanon is on the fringe of the fishing industry, where around 90 % of fish consumed are imported despite that around 45,000 families live from this industry.
