

WHAT IS MSP?

Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP) is a fundamental tool for a development of the Sustainable Blue Economy. It allows us to sustainably manage the use of our seas and oceans, to reduce conflicts, create synergies between human activities and ensure they take place in an efficient and safe way.

WHAT'S NEXT?

The next generation of EU MSPs will have a key role in:

- Becoming 'Climate-Smart', in line with the European Green Deal.
- Increasing offshore wind capacity in Europe to at least 111GW by 2030.
- Establishing protected areas on 30% and restore at least 20% of the EU's sea areas.
- · Identifying optimal sites for seaweed farming and multi-use.


Targeting to advance the European Green Deal (EGD) transition in the Mediterranean Sea -> transnational cooperation in Maritime Spatial Planning.

Focus on key uses and activities: Offshore Renewable Energies (ORE), fisheries, aquaculture and nature protection.



2. What is the MED MSP Community of Practice ?

"[...] group of **people** who share a **common concern**, a set of **problems**, or an **interest** in a topic and who **come together** to fulfil both individual and group goals. [...] they often focus on **sharing best practices** and creating new knowledge **to advance a domain of professional practice**."









General objectives

- Create a permanent communication and dialogue across borders among experts on MSP to exchange knowledge and experiences and to reach a shared perspective on topics of common interest
- Enhance cooperation between the north and the south and the west and the east of the Mediterranean sea on common MSP challenges and opportunities
- Share practices and knowledge about how to use MSP as an enabler for sustainable blue economy and improved protection of the marine environment
- Provide recommendations supporting regional cooperation on MSP and MSP national processes










Identified topics of work and their relevant initiatives/projects for further engagement



Activities


- +90 experts that meet online and promote cross border dialogue to enhance collaboration between north and south of the Mediterranean.

- MSP supporting local communities' economic activities in the Southern Mediterranean
- MSP and offshore wind energy
- A sea of knowledge to capitalize within MSP processes
- Sharing knowledge as key for advancing MSP practice: examples form other communities of practice and knowledge platforms
 - Co-development of policy solutions for better integration of biodiversity conservation in MSP and sectoral policies (MSP4BIO) – 24 June 2024
 - Blue Azores: strengthening the network of marine protected areas in Azores islands -19th of July 2024

 - Exchanges with relevant CoPs from other Sea Basins




3. The challenge: Multi-use & Maritime Spatial Planning




- Multi-use encouraged in several Green Deal strategies
- E.g. "the Commission will work with Member States to include areas for multi-use when revising national MSPs" Delivering on the EU offshore renewable energy ambitions
