Pooling R&I investments & aligning national programmes at pan-European scale

while creating and supporting the conditions for healthy oceans for the people by 2050 Will design, steer and support a just and inclusive transition to a regenerative and circular blue economy








THE UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainble Develpment

SRIA – Strategic R&I Agenda

Intervention Areas are set in the Annual Work Programme of the Partnership and are based on SRIA and the MS and Associated Countries' priorities.

These areas are selected to maximize participation while reinforcing the EU blue economy through innovative solutions and improved resilience of marine ecosystems







SBEP FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

JOINT TRANSNATIONAL CALLS - Annual calls over 6 years; Areas for calls activitites will be developed according to an annual cycle based on priorities of the Partnership countries

Additional Activities:

- **SHARING RESEARCH INFRASTRUCTURES** in-kind sharing national RIs through the development of a transnational access model adapted to SBEP contributing countries
- THEMATIC ANNUAL PROGRAMMING specific tool aimed at fostering the alignment of national research programs, promoting their coordination and international cooperation (in preparation)



The **2023 SBEP First Joint Call** was launched on <u>February 13, 2023,</u> under the theme:



«The Way forward: A thriving sustainable Blue Economy for a Brighter future»


- The 1st SBEP Co-funded call pools national and regional financial resources (about 50 M€) through the participation of the European Commission and 37 Research Funding Organizations (RFOs) from 24 countries:
 - 19 Member-States: Belgium, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and The Netherlands;
 - 4 Associated Countries: Faroe Islands, Iceland, Norway, and Türkiye;
 - 1 Third country: Brazil



19 Selected proposals

Priority Areas

The 19 selected projects address all the five Priority Areas of the call. PA3 has mobilised the strongest response, accounting for 12 of the 19 selected projects.

PA5 - Digital Twin of the Ocean (DTO) test use cases at EU sea-basins and the Atlantic Ocean	2	10,5

Sea-Basins


The majority of the selected proposals **address more than one sea-basin**, being that the Mediterranean Sea, Atlantic Ocean, the Baltic Sea and the North Sea are equally addressed, and the Black sea is only addressed in 2 pps.




1st SBEP JTC 2023 19 selected proposals

The kick-off of the 19 projects took place 25, 26 September, 2024 in Madrid


The 2024 SBEP Second Joint Call

was launched on February 1, 2024, under the theme:

«Unified paths to a climate-neutral, sustainable, and resilient blue economy: engaging civil society, academia, policy, and industry»

<u>Four Intervention areas</u> were defined as the basis for Partnership activities for 2024:

- Digital Twins of the Ocean
- Blue Economy Sectors
- Managing Sea Uses
- Blue Bioresources



2024 SBEP 2ND JOINT CALL



The **2nd SBEP Co-funded** call pools national and regional financial resources (about **40 M€**) through the participation of the European Commission and **38 Research Funding Organizations (RFOs) from 26 countries:**

- 20 Member-States: Belgium, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and The Netherlands;
- **5 Associated Countries:** Faroe Islands, Iceland, Norway, Tunisia and Türkiye;
- 1 Third country: Brazil


Co-branding of calls with IOC/UNESCO – selected projects are endorsed as OD projects

2024 SBEP 2ND JOINT CALL - Ongoing

Application deadline pre-proposals 10th April 2024 **113 pre-proposals submitted**

1st stage

110 eligible/conditionally eligible PPwere scientifically evaluated59 pre-proposals invited to submit a full proposal



2nd stage

Deadline for submitting full proposal: 6 November 2024 15:00 CET **Start project – June 2025**



2025 SBEP 3RD JOINT CALL

Next and third SBEP Joint transnational call will be launched in September 2025






Sharing of Research Infrastructures

Additional activity led by Italy joined by many partners as providers of Research Infrastructure)

- 1. Collect RI potential commitment at national level
- 2. Launch a Call for expression of interest
- 3. Partnership launches a Joint Call for access to RIs
- 4. RI providers receive the EU co-funding for the provision of the facilities to the granted projects
