A strong governance framework is needed to align actions at Union, regional, national, and local levels through the various sea basins, involving both EU and non-EU countries.

Strengthened Governance Framework

Ocean Act: by 2027 that will build on a revision of the MSP Ocean Board: stakeholders supporting the Commission in implementation

Ocean Pact dashboard: to monitor and report progress

Working together at regional level: sea basin approach/ Black, Baltic, Mediterranean, Arctic seas

Financial support – integrated approach to funding from private and public sources, incl. to enhance coastal communities' resilience through EU financing and EIB loans.



OCEAN-RELATED TARGETS IN EU LEGISLATION AND POLICY – a selection

- Ensure conservation of marine biological resources and management of fisheries.
- Achieve the goals of the Common Fisheries Policy (CFP)
- River Basin Management Plans
 (RBMPs) and Programmes of
 Measures to achieve good chemical
 and ecological status)
- Reduce and monitor water pollution caused by nitrates used in agriculture
 - Natura 2000 network of protected sites.
 - Restore at least 30% of the EU's degraded sea areas by 2030, all ecosystems in need of restoration by 2050. Submit National Restoration Plans by mid-2026.
 - Ban certain single-use plastic items.



- Achieve Good environmental status (GES) of marine waters by 2020.
- Monitor and assess bathing water
 - Climate-neutrality in the EU by 2050
 - MS cooperate on goals for offshore renewable generation to be deployed within each sea basin by 2050
- Shore-side electricity supply for certain vessels
- Inventory of Hazardous Materials EU list of ship recycling facilities.
- Maximum limits for yearly average GHG intensity of energy used by ships.
- Passenger and container ships to use onshore power supply (OPS) or alternative zero-emission technologies.
- Special Emission Control Areas / Pollution control zones

Enhancing maritime security and defence as a prerequisite

- UXO strategy for cutting-edge detection and disposal technologies
- Deeper cooperation between the EU, its Arctic Member states and like-minded Arctic States
- A pilot for a European (UxV) unmanned drone fleet
- Maritime cooperation in upcoming new Strategic and Comprehensive Partnerships with partner countries in North-Africa and the Middle East



Strengthening EU ocean diplomacy and international rules-based governance.

- Strategic approach to EU fisheries external action, including a new generation of SFPAs
- Swift ratification and implementation of the BBNJ Agreement and support implementation in developing countries through the EUR40 million contribution to the Global Ocean Programme
- Entry into force and implementation of phase 1 of WTO agreement and conclusion of negotiations of phase 2
- Mandatory use of the digitalised EU catch certification scheme IT CATCH from January 2026
- Piloting of an International Platform for Ocean Sustainability
- Championing protected zones in Southern Ocean



Guiding principles for implementation



The Pact aims at a holistic approach and collaboration across Member States, regions, and with stakeholders: fishers, blue economy professionals, innovators, investors, scientists, and civil society.
